Cornerstone Online Giving

In today's changing economy, many people no longer use paper checks and much prefer the convenience (and accountability) of online methods of transferring money. In recognition of this, Cornerstone will begin offering the option of online giving through a link on our website. This option will allow for debit card and e-check/ACH (checking account draft) giving. Additionally, this option will enable the giver to set up automatic, recurring gifts of a specified amount and to a particular fund if so desired. One-time gifts are also accommodated through this service. Credit card giving will not be permitted as the church does not wish to passively endorse credit card debt. This is a secure method to give electronically, as the link on our website will direct givers to a secure online portal.

However, the convenience that online giving provides does come with a small cost to the church (not to the giver). Debit card gifts will be charged a fee of 3.0% plus \$0.30 per transaction. E-check/ACH gifts will be charged 1.0% plus \$0.30 per transaction. For this reason, if you do give through our website, **we encourage you to give by E-check/ACH**, since more of the giver's money will be applied to ministry as opposed to transaction fees.

Because of these costs, however, we would prefer those who desire an automatic, recurring giving option to consider giving to Cornerstone through **your bank's online bill-pay service**. The majority of banks will allow you to make recurring gifts to Cornerstone through this service free of charge, in the same way as you might automatically pay a utility or credit card bill. This will require you to list Cornerstone as a payee in your bill-pay service, and provide an address. Banks commonly mail paper checks free of charge through this service on behalf of their clients, and some members of Cornerstone already give in this way. This is the lowest cost (free to both parties) option that still accommodates the convenience of automatic and recurring giving.

We will continue to have an offering during our worship, accepting paper checks and cash on Sunday mornings for those who wish to give in these ways. In addition, because we believe that the practice of giving has an important teaching function in our lives (and in the lives of our children), if you are giving online, we would encourage you to consider using the personalized giving envelopes you receive (though any piece of paper would do), and each week write down the amount you are giving on the outside of the envelope, fold it in half, and place it in the offering pouch as a tangible reminder of your offering to the Lord. May it be an act of grateful worship!

EASTERN DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Eddie was born and raised in East Tennessee. After meeting Jesus and having his life radically changed as a young adult, he immediately had a heart to reach people with the Gospel. It wasn't long before he knew nothing other than a life committed to ministry would satisfy him. Over the years, his journey has taken him from serving in small towns in the south to the great mission field of New York City. For nearly 13 years Eddie served as Senior Pastor at Salem Church on the north shore of Staten Island. While serving there, the church experienced a wonderful spiritual revitalization and had a deep impact in the community.

He and his wife, Jessica, are Liberty University alumni, where their daughter Madison is currently a student. He has degrees from Liberty Theological Seminary and a DMin from Dallas Theological Seminary.

After more than 20 years in ministry, Eddie's main passion is still to share the Gospel in Word and deed. As District Superintendent, his calling is to come alongside pastors and leaders in order to help them live well and lead their ministries with vision and passion, so that Christ will be glorified throughout the district.

His belief is, "It takes healthy leaders to lead healthy, growing churches. And only healthy, growing churches will reproduce disciples, leaders and new ministries. That is the aim of the eastern district."
